





As you read about each book below, place a bookmark or a piece of paper in that book so that you can find it easily as you look up the texts in the lessons.




**GENESIS** means beginning, and it is the first book of the Bible. You will find it close to the front, after the Table of Contents and a few other pages of information about the Bible.

How many chapters does the book of Matthew have?








MARK is also a book about Jesus. It comes right after Matthew but is a shorter book than Matthew.

### LESSON 1 God Plans Ahead

The Bible is a story about God's love for people on this earth. Here is how the story begins . . .

Long before the earth existed, God planned ahead.

God, the Creator, planned to make people in His very own image. They would be like Him in many ways. Most important, they would have free choice. They would not live by instinct like most animals, nor like robots who just do as they are programmed. They would be thinking, reasoning people who could choose what to do.




God always plans ahead. He knew He wanted a world with flowers, whales, parrots and people.

On the first day, God started with **light.** He knew plants and creatures would need light in order to grow, and the people and animals would also need light to see what they were doing. He created the spectrum of colors, which is what light is made of. Aren't you glad He did not make our world just black, white and gray?



The next day God created something equally important if life was to survive on this planet.

#### The atmosphere.

The reason we cannot live on the moon is because there is no atmosphere there – no air that we can breathe, no humidity or moisture that humans, animals and plants need in order to live.





On the third day, God created **dry land** so we wouldn't have to swim all the time. After that, He just kept on creating.

God created food for the creatures He planned to place on His new planet.


He created **shelter** for them under and in the massive trees. He created **plants** in the sea to provide food and shelter and oxygen for the sea animals He was planning.

He also created automatic air purifiers. That's right! Leaves and all plants with green in them, work as air cleaners and make more oxygen for us to breathe.

Isn't God awesome! He thinks of EVERYTHING!





On the fourth day, God set up more ways of keeping time besides just counting the days. The lights for both day and night that we call the sun, moon and stars appeared.





















God was not finished yet. He formed a man out of clay and named him Adam.

After seeing all the animals in pairs, Adam was lonely, even with all those "pets." Did God know this?

He certainly did! God caused Adam to fall into a deep sleep and then took a rib out of Adam's side and used it to make a woman!

That's right! Adam loved Eve because she was a part of him.



God made the seventh day as a special time for rest and friendship with Him, the loving Creator. God's plans were not only for the physical needs of people but for their social and spiritual needs as well. No matter how busy He was, He would take time to be with them every week.

Remember that God created people with the ability to choose. He did not force them to love and trust Him. What if one of them chose to disobey? God knew that life apart from Him was not possible. But He could not bear the thought of losing even *one* of His children. So God had planned ahead for that emergency.



Sure enough, the two new humans did make a very bad choice.

Did they immediately drop dead?






You can read this sad story in Genesis, chapter 3:1-7.

God's plan swung into action. He came to visit Adam and Eve in their garden home. They felt guilty, afraid and naked. God made them clothes so they would feel comfortable and He explained His emergency plan.

A descendant of the woman would save them (see Genesis 3:15). Until that person came to save them, God asked them to do something that made them very sad. They had to kill a little lamb. This was so hard for them to do. Every time this happened, it would remind them of the Perfect One who would die because of their bad choices just like the innocent lamb died even though it had done nothing wrong.

Despite Adam and Eve's mistakes, God made it possible for them to choose to accept


His gift of life.



Would other humans accept God's offer of life?




It would be so hard to kill a little lamb. I'm glad that stopped when the Perfect One came.




# LESSON 2 Coming To Be With Us






### Read the real story of Christmas in Luke 2 in your Bible. But first, let's look at the events that led up to the first Christmas.



And he was. Joseph did not understand what had happened, or how Mary could be pregnant.


Where they lived, if a woman got pregnant from someone other than her husband, she was punished by stoning. People threw rocks at her until she was dead.



God had told an old man named Simeon that he would not die until he saw the Messiah. Simeon held Baby Jesus in his arms. He was so excited!




After King Herod died, Joseph, Mary and young Jesus moved back from Egypt. Herod's son was ruling in the part of the country were Bethlehem was, so they went to the town of Nazareth where they would be safe.

There, Joseph ran a carpenter shop and Jesus helped His dad. (Joseph was really his stepdad since God was Jesus' real father.)


Joseph was older than Mary, and already had children, so Jesus had stepbrothers, who were not always kind to Him. They probably missed their mother, who had died. Sometimes it annoyed them that their dad's new wife (Mary) thought her little Son was perfect, even though He really was.



Sometimes people think that children from poor families or step families cannot be as successful as other children. But Jesus came from a step family, and they were very poor. What does the Bible say about Him. Read Luke 2:52.




I have a stepfather who has other children too. We don't always get along, and sometimes they are mean to me. It makes me feel better to know that Jesus understands how I feel because He grew up with these same problems.





My family does not have very much money. Sometimes things are really hard. It makes me feel better to know that Jesus understands exactly what that is like. I can talk to Him about my problems because I know He understands.

My family runs a business, and so I spend a lot of my time helping my parents with their work. Sometimes it is hard to work so much when I know other children are playing, but I know Jesus understands. He worked in a family business too!



When Jesus was 12 years old, His parents took Him to the temple in Jerusalem. It was very exciting. He got to watch the priests do their work, join in the singing, and watch the sacrifices.


While He was there, He came to understand WHO He was and what His job would be. He watched the lambs being sacrificed and realized that HE was God's Lamb.

He spent time in the temple talking with the priests. They were very surprised at how much He knew about the Scriptures (the Bible back then), and how smart He was.

Thinking Jesus was with them, Joseph and Mary had started home. When they realized He was missing they were very worried. But they found Him in the temple talking with the priests.

In Luke 2:49 read Jesus' answer to Mary when she finally found Him.





Jesus returned home with His parents. He helped Joseph in his carpenter shop as He continued growing up. Jesus trusted God to tell Him when to start His job as God's Son and special Lamb.





## LESSON 4 Jesus Begins His New Job

John the Baptist was a prophet. A prophet is someone who speaks for God and gives His messages to people. John talked to people about turning back to God. He was trying to help them get ready to meet Jesus, God's son, who would be coming soon. When they gave their lives to God, John dipped them under the water in the river to show that their old sinful lives were washed away and now they had a new spiritual life.



Jesus lived at home and worked as a carpenter until He was 30 years old. Now it was time for Him to start His public job as God's Son.

Jesus came down to the water and asked John the Baptist to baptize Him. John did not want to. Jesus had been perfect all His life. He did not have any sins to be forgiven.



Read Luke 3:22. Ever since then, Christians have used a dove as a symbol representing God's Holy Spirit.

Jesus was not quite ready to begin His ministry. He left the crowded river bank to find a quiet place where He could pray and talk with God. He walked far up into the rocky wilderness where He could be alone—just Him and God.



How long did Jesus stay in the wilderness? You can find the answer in Luke 4:1. Write it on the line below.




What a long time to go without food!





Jesus told the servants to pour a drink for the man in charge of the party. The servants *did not* want to do this!





Those who are gentle can be happy, for the entire world will belong to them.




Those who really want to be good can be happy, for they will be completely satisfied.

You can also be happy if you are picked on and treated badly because you are my friend. Be really glad, for you will have great rewards in heaven.





When Jesus lived on earth, some people had a terrible skin disease called leprosy. In those days it was incurable. People's skin got worse and worse until their fingers and toes and sometimes their noses rotted and fell off.




People who had leprosy were made to live outside the town and away from healthy people. If healthy people walked by, lepers had to shout, "Unclean! Unclean!" so that the healthy people would not accidently get too close and catch the disease.

Everyone was afraid of people with leprosy. They were even hated by many people.

One day when Jesus and His friends were walking, ten men with leprosy were nearby. "Unclean! Unclean!" they shouted. But when they heard it was Jesus they shouted, "Please help us!" And Jesus did!

Jesus sent all of them to the priest to be inspected. Only a priest could pronounce a leper recovered and allow him to go back home to his family and friends. The priest examined the ten men. They had brand new skin. There was no trace of the leprosy left, not even scars! He pronounced them healed.

Later . . . one man came back to Jesus.




You can can the story about the lepers in Luke 17:11-19.






Some people still get leprosy today but there are medicines that can help them.

Jesus ignored them and went into the girl's room. You can read what happened next in Luke 8:55, 56.











Because there were some people who hated Jesus and wanted to have Him killed. Keeping it a secret would make Jarius' family and Jesus safer. While Jesus was on His way to Jairus' house, a woman who had been bleeding for 12 years was in the crowd. She hoped Jesus could heal her too, but she was too shy to ask Him. [This story is found in Luke 8:43-48.]



Jesus cares about women's problems too!



The people thought He was being silly. There was a huge crowd with lots of people bumping into each other. It could have been *anyone*. But Jesus knew about the sick woman. He knew she was too shy to ask, and He was happy to help her.

Fearfully, the woman came forward. "It was me," she said. She was afraid she was in real trouble for bothering this famous teacher.



"Oh, Thank You, Thank You!" cried the man.




On his way home, he met a man who owed him a little bit of money. "I want my money right now!" he shouted.

Both the sheep and goats will say, "We don't remember ever seeing You in any of those situations!"


Then I will tell them, "The things you did for even the most unimportant person counted as if you did them for Me!"

I'm going HOME!










## LESSON 8 Jesus Can Fix Any Problem


The disciples were terrified! They knew other fishermen had drowned in that lake during sudden storms. Where was Jesus?

"We have no money to buy food for this many people," responded a disciple.





Jesus prayed and thanked God for the food. Then He broke the bread in half, and in half again. He just kept breaking it, and there seemed to be more each time!



One night, Jesus took His friends and went to pray. Many things were on His mind.




Oh God! I don't want to be hurt and die! If there is any other way for my friends to be saved, please change this plan!

Pilate's wife sent him a message begging him to let Jesus go.


Pilate decided to have Him whipped. Then maybe the crowd would feel sorry for Him.

Pilate washed his hands in front of the crowd. "I am innocent of this man's blood," he said. "His death will be your responsibility."


The soldiers tried to make Jesus carry His cross to the place of execution, but He was so badly hurt He kept fainting. Someone had to help Him.

In the temple as Jesus died, the priest was just getting ready for the evening sacrifice of a lamb. Suddenly there was an earthquake. The tall curtain that hid the holiest part of the temple from view, was ripped from top to bottom. The priest dropped his knife and the lamb ran away!

Well, uh, what do you know about it anyway, stranger?






When the men reached home they invited the stranger to come in for supper. The conversation continued.
